Cherokee Nation Starts Internet Program

The Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma is developing an Internet system, which when completed, will enable one to access it and pull up most any kind of information pertaining to the history, culture, spirituality, and current events of the Cherokees.

A grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services will help fund this monumental project which will enable the public to obtain the technology necessary for scanning, and cataloguing the tribe's most significant documents.

Much of the documentation that describes the history of the Cherokees is now limited to one location and must be protected due to their fragility. With the new system, thousands of documents will be made available to researchers and the general public through the world-wide-web. The project is expected to be completed in the spring of 2011.
